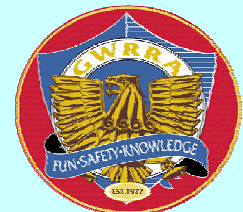

Greetings from your Assistant Rider Educator

I don't know how I will be able to fill the shoes of the previous two Rider Educators, but I'll do the best I can while Jim is away. First of all I would like to congratulate Jim and Brenda for being the new International Couple of the Year and I am glad that my family and I were able to be there and be a part of the celebration.

### RIDING IN HOT WEATHER

The weather that we encountered while at Wing Ding is the reason for my first newsletter article. Riding in hot weather can be very uncomfortable and dangerous. Following are some tips that I found that help cool us down and keep us safe

- Drink water, Gatorade or some form of electrolytes prior to your ride
- Increase use of salty snacks to help retain body hydration
- Dress with light colored and light weight fabrics
- Short sleeves are actually hotter on your skin and increase chance of sunburn

- Use sunblock on exposed skin
- Cover your neck with a soaked, cold bandana
- Soak your Silky or skull cap with cold water
- Stop frequently, stretch, move around, drink water, cool down in the shade
- Ride early in the day before temperatures rise
- Having a choice of roads, take the road at higher altitude
- Check out some of the new cooling riding garments at [www.ridecool.com](http://www.ridecool.com)
- Cover the black seat of your motorcycle with a white hand towel
- Ladies suggestion: ice in the bra...thanks to Lori Manning

To prevent dehydration and hypothermia, a motorcyclist should stop every thirty minutes to consume at least a quart of water plus prepare another quart to consume while riding between breaks. Water, milk, fruit juices, as well as many of the commercially available "sport" drinks are excellent fluid replenishes, but do not drink anything containing alcohol or caffeine as they will actually dehydrate your body.

You can also reduce dehydration by wearing light colored, loose fitting clothes and drenching these clothes with cool water at each thirty-minute break. This artificial perspiration can make the body feel 20 degrees cooler and reduce the loss of body fluids. At 60 miles per hour on a 90° F day a soaked shirt and jeans will be bone dry within twenty minutes. If you experience nausea, dizziness, headache, fatigue, rapid pulse, shortness of breath, disorientation, cold and clammy skin or hot and dry skin, you should take immediate steps to rapidly cool down the body.

The best and fastest method is to get into a tub of cool water and add ice as fast as you can stand it until you core temperature has returned too normal. If a tub is not available, a cool stream or lake will help and if that is not available simply soak your clothes with ice water from your cooler.
